

Pedestal or Step: use milk crate or box for apples, which contains water bottles or sand for weights.



MAMIE FAY 1872-1949 Nationally or Group P.S.122 Queens

Ms. MAMIE FAY was the first principal of P.S.122 Queens from 1925 to 1942. Also, she was the first female principal in all of Queens. She worked effortlessly to protect children's rights. The organization she used to be a member became child protective services.






